Olympic champ Andy's post box will stay gold

One year on from Andy Murray's Olympic victory, the Royal Mail have revealed that the post box painted gold in his honour will remain in its blinged-up shade.

The post box, on Dunblane High Street, was originally painted gold last summer to mark the tennis star's gold medal win in the men's singles.

It has since received a fresh coat of gold paint and a plaque to permanently remind residents and visitors of the special local link to London 2012.

The Dunblane post box has become a treasured local landmark, with people coming from far and wide to take snaps,

especially after Murray's recent Wimbledon win.

It was one of 111 across the country painted gold by Royal Mail last year to mark the successes of Team GB and ParalympicsGB.

The decision to keep the post boxes gold marks the first time in Royal Mail's history that it has painted its iconic post boxes a different colour permanently to mark an historic achievement.
