



Dear Resident,

SP Energy Networks (SPEN) is responsible for delivering a reliable, consistent and safe electricity supply to customers. We do this by investing in and strengthening the network. An important component of this work is the Beauly to Denny Project which received Scottish Government's consent, and is an essential infrastructure upgrade to the high voltage transmission line between Beauly, near Inverness and Denny, near Falkirk. The Project involves replacing the existing 132kv overhead transmission line with a 400kv transmission line and geographically covers Scottish and Southern Power Distribution (SSEPD) and SP Energy Networks network area.

The 21km section of the 220km line that lies within SPEN's network area connects the SSEPD section of line at the Wharryburn, Sheriffmuir and links to a new substation at Denny near Falkirk.

Currently works in and around SPEN's area on Sheriffmuir are site investigations, environmental and archaeology surveys, tree/vegetation clearance. In May 2014 work will be undertaken to construct access tracks. Foundation work for the Towers will commence in February 2015 and the Tower assembly/erection will follow in July 2015.

Traffic management arrangements will be agreed with the Local Authority and put in place for the duration of the works in the Dunblane/Sheriffmuir/Bridge of Allan area to ensure vehicles, plant and machinery can access the designated work areas safely, minimising disruption to local residents. However, we feel it is important to advise residents to take into account the possibility of delays and make alternative arrangements during any necessary short periods of road disruption of which you will be duly advised.
