

## **A finance whizz from Dunblane has scored world class marks in her professional exams**

Laura Cameron has achieved the highest marks in the world in the latest Chartered Institute of Management Accountants (CIMA) exams.

The 27-year-old, who is on the finance graduate scheme at BSkyB, came out tops in the exams that were held in November last year.
