Many tough trees for Scotland in this list.
This site will hold 4 areas that will contain:

Pears

Ratray (Longeveiile) * - one of our best Scottish pears
Grey Benvie * - small sweet early
Green Pear of Yair * - from the borders
Laird Lang - actually American, no doubt a Scottish head Gardener named it!
Hessle - very productive, well known in Scotland
Green Chisel - old traditional fruit
Maggie *- small sweet fruit
Christie * - from Carse of Gowrie
Goudnap * Small sweet Carse fruit
Fair Maid * - early small pear
Crawford *- early Scottish small pear
West Oaks * - an unusual long brownish fruit unique to Carse of Gowrie and selected by Plants with Purpose
Planted at a spacing of 4m or more ideally. They will look superb in flower in early spring.

Plums

1 year old on St Julien Rootstock or VVA -1
Opal - does very well in Dunkeld Victoria - the most productive in Scotland
Czar - darker red eater
Marjories Seedling - nice black plum
Persnore yellow - old traditional fruit Rivers
Early Prolific - does well in Clyde Valley
Warwickshire Drooper - nice shape of tree 8
Purple Persnore - a very nice plum at its best
Giant Prune - a long, sweet, red plum.
Kirke's Blue - another darker plum occasionally seen
Belgian Blue - very big plums
Monarch - dark fruits
Gordon Castle * - a Scottish greenish variety
Cherry Plum Mirrabelle - very early flowers, hardy, small yellow or red fruits in July

Damson

on St Julien Rootstock
Merryweather - tough delicious fruits
Shropshire Prune - the main damson planted
Cherries Merchant,
Governor Wood,
Black Oliver
- note all would be difficult to harvest as they are loved by birds!

Apples

This upper area will also hold Apple Varieties on M25 vigorous Stocks 2/3 year old These are fairly big trees and thus a little more effort involved in planting them, but will however yield sooner as many will be feathered. Some of these may be sites elsewhere in the Laigh Hills.

Ribston Pippin - late keeper
Port Allen Russet * - local eater
Laxtons Fortune - productive mid-season fruit
Bloody Ploughman *- for the name and local Carse of Gowrie apple
Ashmeads Kernel - late keeper
Lass Of Gowrie *- Early great for jellies
Coul Blush *- Tough northern variety
Lady of The Lake *- Like a James Grieve, from Carse
Red James Grieve * Very productive and great pollinator
Hood's Supreme * - from Angus Jupiter - strong Cox-like eater
Fiesta - Cox-like eater
Friars Pippin * - a very rare tree from Clyde Valley

Crimson Newton Wonder - many old trees in Scotland
Siddington Russet * - from Galloway
Stirling Castle * - local cooker, best on M25
Blenheim Orange - well known 100 years ago
Megginch Favourite * - Carse Apple
Scots Bridget * - very productive, strong tree
Reinette Grise - Very nice and productive russet
White Melrose * - Ealy codlin type fruit

Clydeside * - green flushed red cooker
Lord Derby - very well known cooker
Stirling Castle* - Local variety
Stobo Castle * - Nice round stripey cooker
Maggie Sinclair * - Clyde Valley strong tree
Keswick Codlin - Early fruit, very reliable
Catshead - very big fruit parent of Lord Derby Bramley - best cooker
Scot's Dumpling * - gorgeouse pink almost double flowers
Reinette Grise- great producer
Grenadier - the first cooker, reliable
