

## Playing Field Site

An 80m x 8m strip of land to the North West of the playing field can accommodate up to 50 trees at a spacing of 3m x 4m, with a possible additional 50m strip beyond the seat. This site is South facing, and backed by larger native and exotic trees of various ages.
